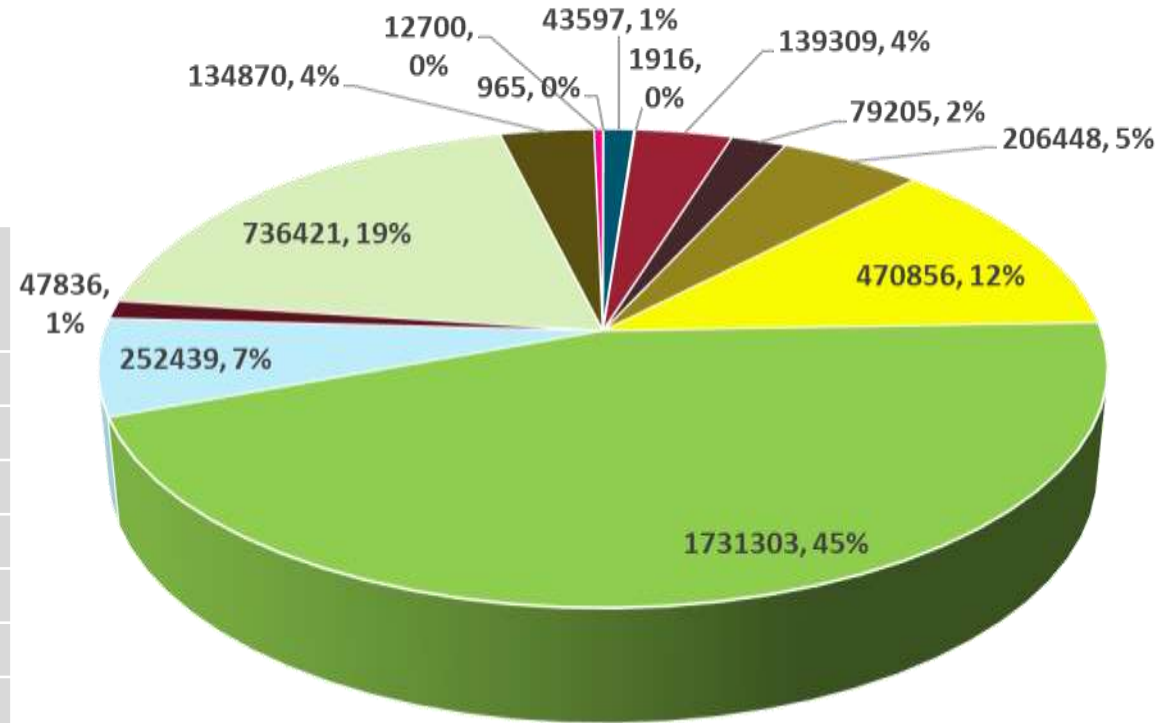

INTRODUCTION

WASTE HAS A VALUE WHEN MANAGED CORRECTLY-TO BE CONSIDERED AS A RESOURCE

THE WASTE MANAGEMENT CHAIN FROM GENERATION TO DISPOSAL MUST BE MANAGED;

THE ACCREDITATION PROCESS IS A TOOL TO ENSURE THAT WASTE IS MANAGED WELL;

WASTE GENERATOR (**HOSPITALITY SECTOR EG. HOTELS**) vs WASTE SERVICE PROVIDER (**ORGANIC WASTE TREATMENT FACILITIES EG. YWASTE COMPOSTING**);

WHY ACCREDITATION?

- By-law requirement
- Help to understand your business and your contribution to waste management;
- Standardization of processes;
- Mind shift;

IMPORTANT DEFINITIONS

- **ACCREDITED SERVICE PROVIDER** means a person or entity accredited by the City in accordance with its guidelines published from time to time and who provides a waste management service in the City and may include, but is not limited to, **LARGE AND SMALL BUSINESS, ENTREPRENEURS, COMMUNITY COOPERATIVES, AND VENTURE LEARNERSHIPS**
- **WASTE MANAGEMENT SERVICES** are those services usually provided to reduce the impact of waste in a responsible and sustainable manner this includes but is not limited to: clearing, cleaning, collecting, removing, chipping of greens from horticultural or arboreal activity, composting, crushing of clean construction or demolition waste and builders rubble, recovering, separating, sorting, reusing, processing, treating, transporting and disposing, landfarming or landfilling of waste, and the deployment of waste-to-energy mechanisms or systems that include incineration and none-incineration technologies or processes.

DUE TO THE ABOVE NATURE OF BUSINESS IT IS IMPERATIVE TO UNDERSTAND THAT BOTH WASTE GENERATORS PRODUCING WASTE AND WASTE SERVICES PROVIDERS MUST SUBMIT AN INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN TO THE CITY OF CAPE TOWN SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FOR APPROVAL

INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN (IWMP)

- **INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN** means an integrated waste management plan which is required by the City in terms of this By-law or that is required in terms of any other applicable legislation;

CONTENT OF THE IWMP:

An integrated waste management plan must include —

- (a) an assessment of the quantity and type of waste that will be generated;
- (b) a description of the services required to store, collect, transport and dispose of such waste;
- (c) a description of how they intend separating recyclable and non-recyclable material at the point of source;
- (d) the waste minimisation and pollution prevention plans of such waste generator;
- (e) the impact or potential impact on the environment of the waste created by them;
- (f) the type or characteristics of waste produced of an environmentally sensitive nature or the amount of natural resources that are consumed in the manufacturing or production process that result in waste;
- (g) targets for waste production through waste minimisation, re-use, recycling and recovery measures or programmes that can minimise the consumption of natural resources and the method of disposal of waste.

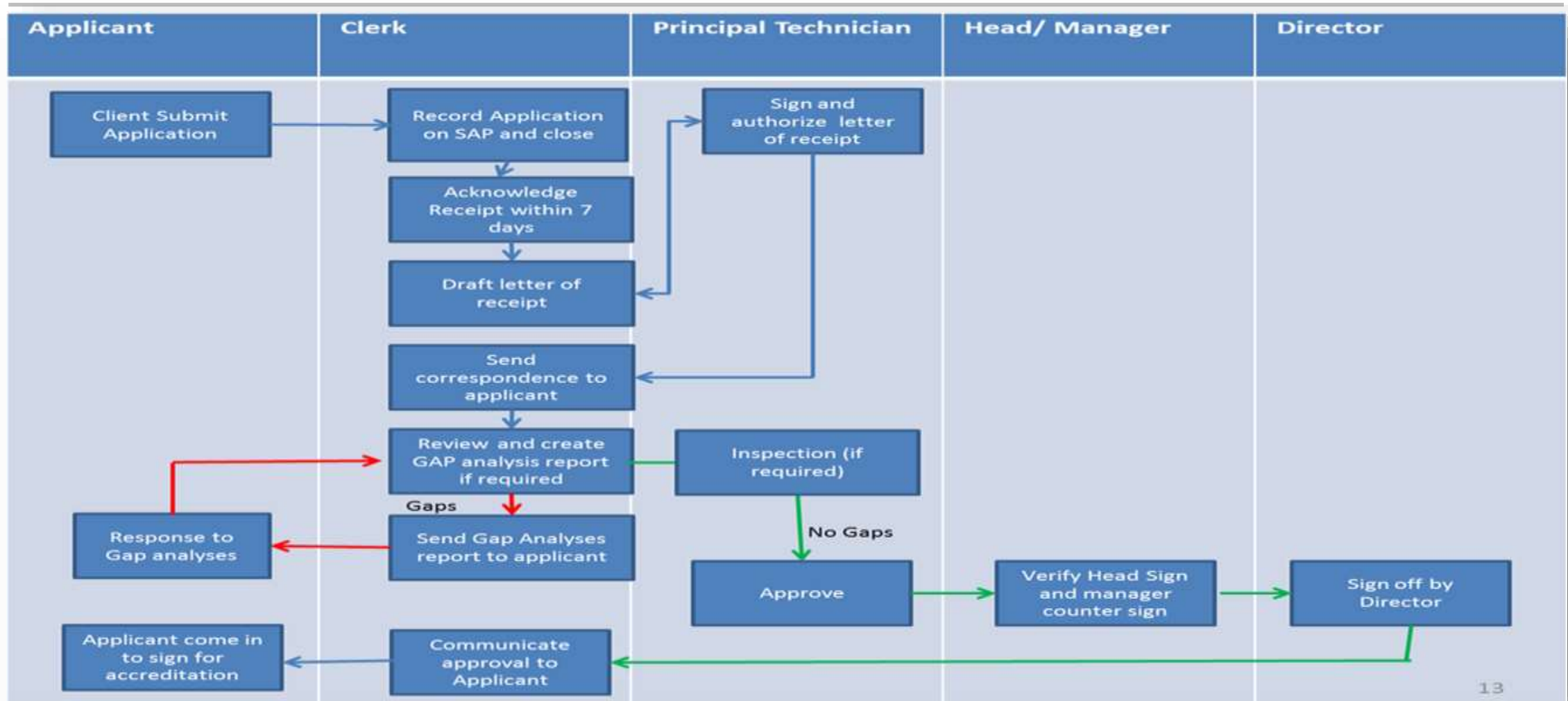

THE APPLICATION PROCESS



WHERE TO APPLY

- Apply at the **OFFICES** of the Solid Waste Dept. 19th Floor, Civic Centre; Hertzog Boulevard, Cape Town;
- Apply by **POST** which will require a request for the applicable forms from, and returned to The City of Cape Town, PO Box 298, Cape Town, 8000, clearly marked “For Attention: Director Solid Waste Management, 19th floor, Civic Centre”.
- **E-MAIL** to receive and return application documents by e-mail;
- **VIA THE INTERNET** (on-line registration and application submission when available on the city’s Website on the Solid Waste webpage);

BENEFITS OF ACCREDITATION

- Being registered on the City of Cape Town's accreditation database, which is shared with the public who might be requiring waste management services, also means **FREE MARKETING**;
